A group of 24 pax will be going to Guizhou and Guangxi province. Both provinces are tribal regions; namely Miao, Chuang and other tribes.

It takes many hours for these preachers to reach just one or two homes by foot or cycle to the remote mountainous areas. The motor bikes will help them carry more Bibles reading materials & also reach more houses faster.

We are deeply grateful to all Frankelites and especially Dorcas cell group who spent time to prepare sumptuous “Nasi Lemak” last Sunday. They raised \$1073.00 towards the cost of Bibles & motorcycles.

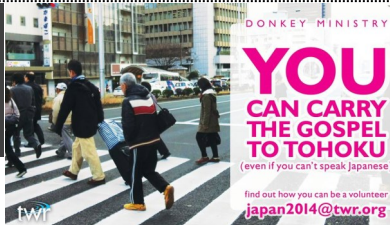
Cafe Leaf today will similarly raise funds. “Back by popular demand!

In his book, the “Normal Christian Life”, Watchman Nee, a Bible teacher and church leader who lived in Fuzhou, China, wrote: “I do not consecrate myself to be a missionary or a preacher. I consecrate myself to God to do His will where I am, be it in school, office, or kitchen, or wherever He may, in His wisdom, send me.”

In this Social Action sermon series, we go back to Scriptures, specifically the Psalms, to see that God cares deeply for people. God’s care and love is to be expressed through His people; ordinary Christians who seek to be salt and light in an often troubled world. How might we respond to the opportunities offered or situations He places us in?
